

# The Rack.

When you play rugby, especially at an armature level, you are aware of other players on the field but not of exactly who they are unless they have the ball. The Rack is supposed to simulate this. You can see how many cards are in an opponents column, but not what they are. I feel this is an important part of the game. I'll produce a mail order version of the game with a good acrylic or wood rack if people like it.

You may copy this to your hearts content providing you do not charge people for it. Other wise download it for free and play away.

Anyway;

1/ Cut out the solid lines in some light card, a cereal packet should be fine.

2/ Fold along the dotted lines to match the elevation profile at the bottom. A light score with a ball point pen and a steel rule may help you bend the card.

3/ Tape the ends and centre pieces in and you are ready to go. Sorry that this is so fiddly.

Elevation pieces.  
cut out and tape one  
at each end and one  
in the middle.
